2:30pm: Shakespeare's Pyramus & Thisbe (from A Midsummer Night's Dream)
- *Perhaps some comedy and swordplay with NoBeard & Gwendolyn at Lyric Stage.
- *Enjoy great physical comedy by Fools Named "O" and LaLa! at Lyric Stage.
- *Like the Bard of Avon? Not sure, but like comedy? Try Shakespeare's Skum two parody shows daily at the Globe. 1:30pm: Antony & Cleopatra; 3pm: Hamlet.
- *Stop by Reveler's Bower (near the Globe) and chat with our living history performers who are demonstrating spinning, leatherworking, and other crafts. And don't miss A Klasse Akte's fun historical shows on beer, ale & food.
- *Check out juggler Paolo Garbanzo at Royal Fox Theatre – great juggler and lover of role-playing games.
- *Enjoy telling a tall tale? Get involved in our Village Court at 4:15pm at Gatehouse Stage. Bring a case to the Justice of the Peace or sit back and witness the fun!
- *Check out Sir Richard Mondes Stories In Songs set at 4:30pm at Cottage Stage.
- *Join in our Danse Macabre at 5:15pm. Line up near Climbing Wall on boardwalk.
