

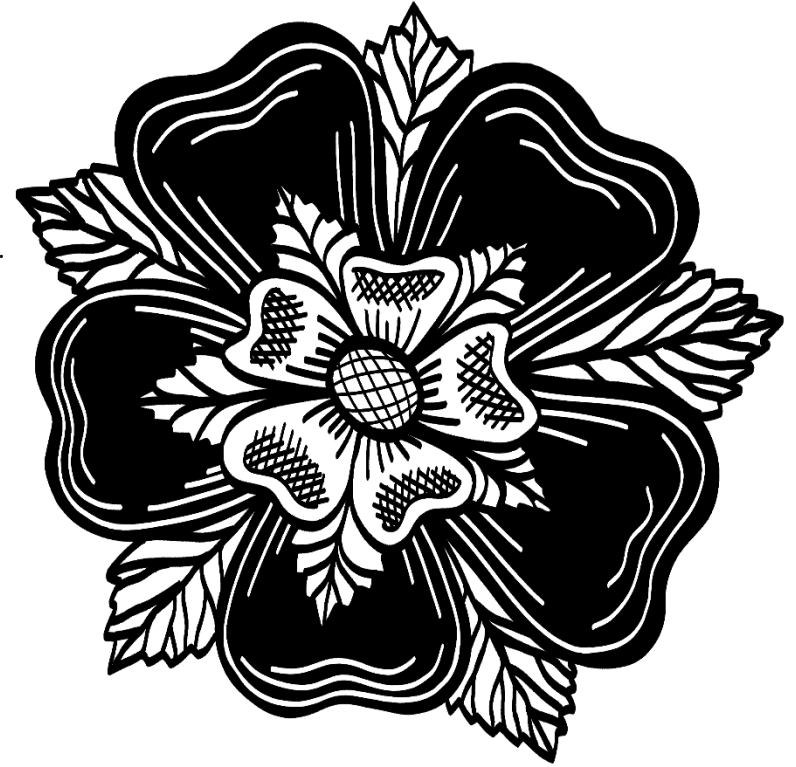
The Noble Definition: Impressive! Of High Birth or Social Status. Lover of the Arts and history.

September 12th & 13th:

SHOWS: Check the program schedule for exact times and locations.

- *A-Per-Se: 11am at the Globe: Revel Grove Madrigals & Dancers.
- *Follow the King and Queen! See The Royal Welcome at 1pm, and for juicy court gossip, don't miss Recollections May Vary at 4:30pm. Both shows at the Globe.
- *Nobles love their birds of prey! Visit the birds at the mews near Dragon's Lair, and see a Knightwings Birds of Prey show at Blackfriars or the Joust Arena.
- *Stop by Reveler's Bower and visit with our living history performers who will be demonstrating spinning, needlework, and leatherworking.
- *Music at the Cottage Stage: Intimate performances featuring folk, Celtic and Renaissance.
- *Is the play your thing? Check out one of these One-Act plays at the Globe:
12pm: The Seduced Countess by Moliere; 12:30pm: The Three Musketeers
2:30pm: Shakespeare's Pyramus & Thisbe (from A Midsummer Night's Dream)
- *Or, if limited on time, check out a scene or two of our STREETspeare program.

- *Like the Bard of Avon? Not sure, but like comedy? Try Shakespeare's Skum two shows daily at the Globe. 1:30pm: Antony & Cleopatra; 3pm: Hamlet.
- *Enjoy the jester-like comedy of those most excellent silent (and not so silent) fools, O and LaLa! at the Lyric Stage.
- *See your fellow noble: Queen of Hoops at the Globe!
- *Stop by the Chapel and see a display of the Crown Jewels!
- *Nobles, see Les S, Moore Will Steal Your Stuff at the Fortune Stage for a primer on how to make sure a pickpocket does not take your pouch filled with gold!
- *Here late? Finish your day at Pub Sing at the White Hart Tavern at 5:45pm or perhaps you'd like to dance with Piper Jones at Boars Head at 6:15pm.
